ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The Malaysian plastics industry is one of the most dynamic and advanced sector within ASEAN. Despite the challenging environment resulting from the global economic slowdown and liberalised global economy, the Malaysian plastics industry recorded total sales value of RM15.8 billion in 2010, representing a strong increase of 8.2% compared to 2009. Export sales increased by 14.5% from RM8.2 billion in 2009 to RM9.4 billion in 2010. Exports had grown strongly between 10 and 15% over the last 10 years, share of exports against sales turnover increased from about 40% in the late 1990s to approximately 60% in recent years. Malaysia is also the largest producer and exporter of stretch films in Asia and the 2nd largest producer and exporter of shopping bags in Asia.

Obviously, the export sector is the main driver for the strong growth of the Malaysian plastics industry. It is forecasted the export would continue to play the major role in driving the Malaysian plastics industry into the next phase of growth.

In this respect, MPMA is pleased to present the **Malaysian-Italian Plastics Technology Conference 2011** which will take place on **10 November 2011 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre**. This Conference is a collaboration between MPMA and the Italian Plastics and Rubber Processing Machinery and Moulds Manufacturers' Association (ASSOCOMAPLAST).

Founded in 1960, ASSOCOMAPLAST, a non-profit Association, now represents about 170 important companies (mainly small/medium sized), Italian plastics and rubber machinery, ancillary equipment and moulds manufacturers. The main aim of ASSOCOMAPLAST is to promote worldwide the knowledge of the Italian plastics and rubber processing technologies that are at the top of the world market, in terms of production and export outputs. It has to be pointed out that the Italian sectoral industry ranks second in the world in export volume and since the beginning of the Fifties has offered a complete range of original and reliable machines. ASSOCOMAPLAST covers the entire process chain from injection moulding, to extrusion, from blow moulding to thermoforming technology etc., covering also auxiliaries technologies as chillers, dosers, dryers, hopper loaders etc.

The Conference will showcase 10 renowned speakers from Italy and will focus on some of the new technologies that could bring about cost savings, innovations, improved productivity and quality which are critical for the Malaysian plastics industry to stay ahead of their competitors in the global market. Emphasis of the presentations would be on the practical use of these technologies and the presentations would also examine factors like costing and profitability.

In essence, the Conference would provide Malaysian plastics manufacturers with appropriate technologies that could give them the edge in developing market opportunities, improve their productivity and compete more effectively in global market.
